

As we mentioned at our Parent Orientation Meeting, Devonshire will be fully implementing the PBIS program this year. We have included copies of the Behavior Matrix, which is the main component of the program. In addition, all of our students have participated in training to review our expectations in each of the areas reflected in the Behavior Matrix. Students will have the opportunity to earn S.H.I.E.L.D.'s (Students helping to improve the environment of learning at **Devonshire**) by consistently demonstrating the appropriate behaviors. These shield cards can be turned in for individual prizes or will help us earn school-wide incentives. MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE

When your student is going to be absent from school, for any reason, **please call the school.** The phone number is **847-593-4398**, there is an answering machine on before 8:00 a.m. If you would like the teacher to put together homework, this would be the time to request it. We would then have the work ready to be picked up in the office after school, or have it sent home with a friend.

If you know that your child will be leaving school early on a particular day, we ask that you send a note to the teacher to inform them what time you will be picking him/her up. This way, the student will have his/her things ready when you arrive at school.

Also, if there will be a change with the way your child is going home, it is necessary to send a note to the teacher. If at the end of the day a student comes to us and says that plans have changed, unless we have received a note or a call from you, we will assume that there is no change and the student will keep to the normal routine.

By taking care of these few things, it makes things go smoothly at school.

These students were chosen from lists of children recommended by Devonshire fourth grade teachers. To be recommended, these students must be excellent role models of our new PBIS program and model for all students how to be responsible, respectful and safe. They must sign a promise to set the right example for all Devonshire students and have the permission of their parents.

Current members of the Safety Patrol understand they may be asked to relinquish their job to allow other deserving students an opportunity to serve their school. Safe Driving Reminders

Overall Safety Tips

- 1. Do not park in the staff parking lot from the hours of 8:00-4:00.
- 2. Obey the traffic signs that are posted throughout the school area.
- 3. Avoid making three-point turns in the dropoff or pick-up areas.

Drop Off Information

- 1. Students should be dropped off in the back of the school on Windsor Drive, or in the front of the school on Roxbury Avenue.

 Supervision begins behind the school at 8:40 and breakfast is served at 8:40.
- 2. Do not pull into the circular drive on Pennsylvania Avenue. This area is reserved for the busses.
- 3. Avoid double parking, as it is illegal and dangerous for the students.

Pick up Information

- 1. Students in grades K-3 will exit out of the front of the school.
- 2. Students in grades 4 and 5 will exit out of the back of the school. They should be picked up along Windsor Drive.
- 3. Students should exit out of the door of the oldest child in that family. That will be their designated pick-up area.

BREAKFAST PROGRAM

We will continue to offer a breakfast program for our students this year. Breakfast will be served in the multi-purpose room from 8:40 to 9:00. The cost of breakfast will be \$1.30, and can be deducted from your child's lunch account.

For those students that are lactose intolerant, please be aware that we have juice for your child to choose at lunch.
