

The format of our goal setting conferences has changed this year to provide more focus on the "whole child." The discussion will include information about social emotional learning, successful conditions for learning, and academic data. You will be receiving a form prior to the conference that will have questions about your child to reflect upon prior to coming to the conference. This will allow you to have deeper conversations with the teacher about your child's strengths and your thoughts about helping your child to have a successful year in school. We are also requesting that the students have a more active role in the conferences so that they will have greater ownership in the goal setting process.
